Groton, along with her family, created the Rainbow Fund at the Rhode Island Foundation. Rhode Island Hospital and the Community Preparatory Charter School are among the recipients of her philanthropy.

About to mark its 10th anniversary, the Pawtucketbased Farm Fresh Rhode Island was honored for its work on initiatives including Market Mobile, Harvest Kitchen and "Bonus Bucks" as well as expanding the number of farmer's markets. The nonprofit is developing a local food system that promotes the environment, health and quality of life of Rhode Island farmers and consumers.

Held at the Rhode Island Convention Center Thursday and attended by more than 700 business leaders, donors, grant recipients and community leaders, the meeting also focused on the Foundation's record \$31 million in grants and new strategic plan.
